The Smallwood Store is a landmark in Southwest Florida history. Almost 100 years ago, local settlers came to get their mail at the Post Office and to buy supplies. The Seminoles visited to trade pelts and deer meat for cloth and ammunition. The Store closed after 65 years but the building and artifacts have been preserved as a Museum.
